## Patient Outcomes

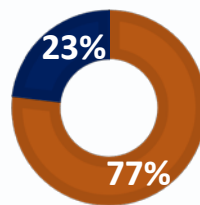
Tucker Pavilion is a 137-bed mental health treatment facility located at Chippenham Hospital in Central Virginia. We offer hope, help, encouragement and support for individuals with emotional, behavioral and mental health needs. We have specialized units to treat a variety of disorders ranging from depression and anxiety to substance use issues and thought disorders. We also serve all ages including the growing geriatric population. Specialized units engage patients through a variety of clinical interventions including Motivational Interviewing, Dialectical Behavioral Therapy, Pet Therapy, and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy.

Tucker Pavilion provides a full range of inpatient, outpatient and emergency services for children, adolescents, adults and geriatric patients. Tucker Wellness and Recovery Center is our outpatient, short-term partial hospitalization program (PHP) for both adults and adolescents. The programs serve as a step down from inpatient treatment or an alternative to inpatient treatment. These programs specialize in mood disorders, including depression and anxiety.

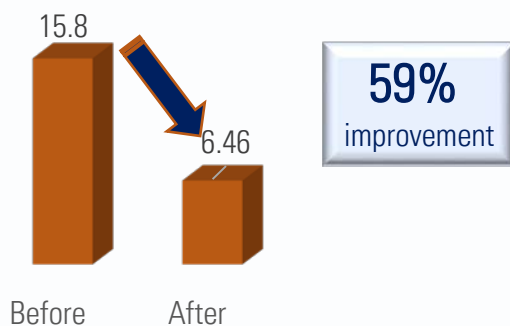

Suicide is the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death among Americans ages 15-24.

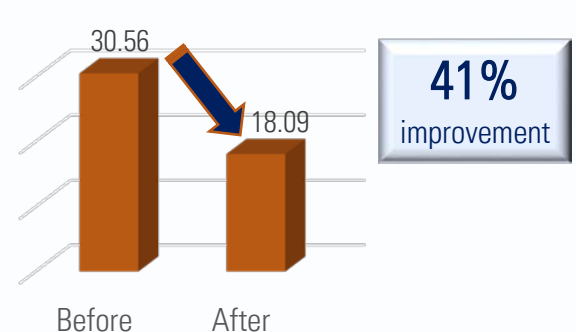
### Our Programs Generate Results
